## *The Governor's Budget Cuts: 'The Perfect Storm' Against Covering the Uninsured*

As the CA Legislature considers deeper state budget cuts to health care and the US Congress decides the fate of health reform during "Cover the Uninsured Week" (March 14-20, 2010), it is important they know that we stand firmly in favor of health reform and coverage for the uninsured.

The proposed state budget cuts (especially the elimination of Healthy Families, ADHC, FPACT, EAPC, remaining Medi-Cal optional benefits) are a "perfect storm" that will break the Orange County healthcare safety net. They do not help solve the problems in our health care system that reform seeks to fix. Our budget woes are intertwined with the need for reform.
